2020/21 Unaudited Actuals

Background:

The Unaudited Actuals are the final PCMS-prepared financial statements of the fiscal year. They are called unaudited because they are self-prepared. The audited financial statements will be prepared by the auditor hired by the school and presented to the board in December or January.

Meeting Date: September 28, 2021

Information:

A summary of budget changes from 20/21 precedes the unaudited actuals report in this presentation. This summary compares the initial budget approved by the board in June to the actuals at year end.

Revenues: While there was significant flux in the various revenues categories, total funding only varied by \$16k, coming in at \$1,387k. State revenue limit sources were higher due to both an increase in per pupil funding and receipt of concentration grant funding due to higher than average FRPM percentages. Federal revenues were as expected. Other state revenues were down because 1) we booked a payable for the Clean Energy Act funding that was never used and is to be returned to the state in 21/22, and 2) because restricted funding was accrued into deferred revenues for 21/22 instead of taken into fund balance. These funds remain available for spending. They just won't be recognized as revenue until they are spent. Local revenue suffered once again due to the inability to have fundraising/donations due to COVID.

Expenses: Overall expenses were down \$56k from anticipated. Once again special education encroachment was much less than budgeted. Some savings were realized in employee benefits due to waiving of benefits. Other savings were achieved in materials and supplies, facilities maintenance, and profession services areas.

Fund Balance: The slight increase in revenues coupled with the decrease in expenses created a larger than anticipated excess for the year of \$126k, which is \$72k over the projected excess of \$54k. Ending fund balance as of 6/30/2021 is \$1,579k. Of that, \$154k is restricted or due back to grantor governments. The remainder ensures that the school continues to have positive cash flow and reserves for economic uncertainty, deferrals or emergencies, giving confidence to the board and the administration that the school is fiscally sound.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT FOR NON-CONSTRUCTION SERVICES (Charter School Executive Director Scope of Work Consultant)

This Independent Contractor Agreement ("Agreement") is made as of 2021, between Casey Taylor and Paradise Charter Middle Schoo
(PCMS). The Charter School and Contractor may collectively be referred to as the "Parties' or individually as a "Party."
── WHEREAS, PCMS is authorized by California Government Code section 53060 to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if those persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required.
□ WHEREAS, PCMS is authorized by California Public Contract Code section 20111 to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of non-construction services, if the contract amount is no greater than the annually adjusted statutory limit, which is \$96,700 in 2021.

WHEREAS, PCMS is in need of those services and/or advice.

WHEREAS, the Contractor is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the services required by PCMS and those services are needed on a limited basis as set forth in this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. Services. The Contractor shall furnish to PCMS Support for executive director work with a focus on state and federal compliance services, as described in **EXHIBIT "A**," attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference ("Services").
- 2. **Term**. Contractor shall commence providing Services under this Agreement on September 1, 2021, and shall continue through June 30, 2022 ("Term"), unless this Agreement is terminated or otherwise cancelled prior to that time.
- 3. Validity of Agreement. This Agreement shall not be a valid contract until it is executed by both Parties, and approved or ratified by the PCMS Board of Trustees. Services shall not be rendered until Agreement is approved by the PCMS Board of Trustees. Should Contractor begin performing Services in advance of receiving notice that this Agreement is approved, any Services so performed in advance of the Board of Trustees approval date will be provided at the Contractor's risk.
- 4. Compensation. For each task assigned, Contractor shall submit a proposed task order to PCMS based on the hourly billing rates included in and EXHIBIT "B." Once approved by PCMS, the Services shall be performed at the hourly billing rates included in EXHIBIT "A" and EXHIBIT "B." The itemized task order shall reflect the hours spent by Contractor in performing its Services pursuant to this Agreement. Payment shall be made for all undisputed amounts within thirty (30) days after the Contractor submits a detailed invoice to PCMS's Accounts Payable Department for Services actually performed. Invoices must reference corresponding Purchase Order number.

- 5. Equipment and Materials. Contractor shall furnish, at her own expense, all tools, labor, materials, equipment, supplies, transportation services, and any other items (collectively, "Equipment") necessary to complete the Services in a manner which is consistent with generally accepted standards of the profession for similar Services. Notwithstanding the foregoing, PCMS shall not be responsible for any damages to persons or property as a result of the use, misuse or failure of any Equipment used by Contractor or the Contractor's agents, personnel, employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s) ("Contractor Parties"), even if such Equipment is furnished, rented or loaned to Contractor or Contractor Parties by PCMS. All original curricular materials provided in conjunction with Contractor's Services must be authorized for use by PCMS only and remain exclusively the intellectual property of the authors.
- 6. Independent Contractor. The Parties agree that the Contractor is an independent contractor or business entity that is: (I) free from the control and direction of PCMS in connection with the performance of the Services, (ii) performing Services that are outside the usual course of PCMS's business, and (iii) customarily engaged in an independently established trade, occupation, or business of the same nature as that involved in the Services performed, PCMS being interested only in the results obtained. Contractor understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees, agents, partner, or joint venture of PCMS, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided to employees of PCMS and/or to which PCMS's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor's employees.
- 7. Employment with Public Agency. Contractor, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that Contractor will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which Services are actually being performed pursuant to this Agreement.
- 8. Certifications, Permits, and Licenses. Contractor represents and warrants to PCMS that Contractor and all of the Contractor Parties have in effect and shall maintain in full force throughout the Term of this Agreement all licenses, credentials, permits and any other legal qualifications required by law to perform the Services and to fully and faithfully satisfy all of the terms set forth in this Agreement.
- 9. Standard of Care. Contractor represents that Contractor has the qualifications and ability to perform the Services in a professional manner, without the advice, control or supervision of PCMS. If any of the Services are performed by any of the Contractor Parties, such work shall only be performed by competent personnel under the supervision of and in the employment of Contractor. Contractor's Services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession for Services to California school districts.
- 10.Safety and Security. Contractor is responsible for maintaining safety in the performance of this Agreement. Contractor shall be responsible to ascertain from PCMS the rules and regulations pertaining to safety, security, and driving on school grounds, particularly when children are present.

- 11. Work Product. Contractor understands and agrees that all matters produced under this Agreement shall become the property of PCMS and cannot be used without PCMS's express written permission. PCMS shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of PCMS.
- 12. Confidentiality. The Contractor and all Contractor Parties shall maintain the confidentiality of all information received in the course of performing the Services. This requirement to maintain confidentiality shall extend beyond the termination of this Agreement.
- 13. Audit. Contractor shall establish and maintain books, records, and systems of account, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, reflecting all business operations of Contractor transacted under this Agreement. Contractor shall retain these books, records, and systems of account during the Term of this Agreement and for three (3) years thereafter. Contractor shall permit PCMS, its agents, other representatives, or an independent auditor to audit, examine, and make excerpts, copies, and transcripts from all books and records, and to make audit(s) of all billing statements, invoices, records, and other data related to the Services covered by this Agreement. Audit(s) may be performed at any time, provided that PCMS shall give reasonable prior notice to Contractor and shall conduct audit(s) during Contractor's normal business hours, unless Contractor otherwise consents.

14. Termination.

- 14.1. With Cause by PCMS. PCMS may terminate this Agreement upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include:
 - **14.1.1.** material violation of this Agreement by the Contractor; or
 - **14.1.2.** any act by Contractor exposing PCMS to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or
 - **14.1.3.** Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency.

Written notice by PCMS shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate, and unless within three (3) calendar days after that notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this Agreement shall upon the expiration of the three (3) calendar days cease and terminate. In the event of this termination, PCMS may secure the required Services from another contractor. If the expense, fees, and costs to PCMS exceed the cost of providing the Services pursuant to this Agreement, the Contractor shall immediately pay the excess expense, fees, and/or costs to PCMS upon the receipt of PCMS's notice of these expense, fees, and/or costs. The foregoing provisions are in addition to, and not a limitation of, any other rights or remedies available to PCMS.

14.2 Without Cause by PCMS. PCMS may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate Contractor only for Services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by PCMS shall be

- sufficient to stop further performance of Services by Contractor. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the Contractor or no later than three (3) days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner. In the event that PCMS terminates this Agreement pursuant to this section, PCMS shall compensate Contractor for Services completed to date.
- **14.3** Upon termination, Contractor shall provide PCMS with all documents produced, maintained or collected by Contractor pursuant to this Agreement, whether or not such documents are final or draft documents.
- 15. Indemnification. To the furthest extent permitted by California law, Contractor shall, at its sole expense, indemnify, and hold harmless PCMS, the State of California, the Board of Trustees, and their agents, representatives, officers, contractors, employees, trustees, and volunteers (the "PCMS Parties") from any and all demands, losses, liabilitles, claims, suits, and actions (the "Claims") of any kind, nature, and description, including, but not limited to, personal injury, death, property damage, and contractors and/or attorneys' fees and costs, directly or indirectly arising out of, connected with, or resulting from the performance of the Agreement or from any activity, work, or thing done, permitted, or suffered by the Contractor under or In conjunction with this Agreement, unless the Claims are caused wholly by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of PCMS Parties. Consultant shall, to the furthest extent permitted by California law, defend the Indemnified Parties at Consultant's own expense, from any and all Claim(s) and allegations relating thereto with counsel approved by PCMS where such approval is not to be unreasonably withheld.
- **16. Insurance.** The Contractor shall procure and maintain at all times it performs any portion of the Services the following insurance:
 - **16.1. General Liability.** One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) general aggregate for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage in the form of Comprehensive General Liability and Contractual Liability.
 - **16.2. Automobile Liability Insurance.** One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) general aggregate for automobile liability insurance that shall protect the Contractor and PCMS from all claims of bodily injury, property damage, personal injury, death, and medical payments arising out of performing any portion of the Services by Contractor.
 - 16.3. Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability Insurance. For all of the Contractor Parties who are subject to this Agreement and to the extent required by the applicable state or federal law, Contractor shall keep in full force and effect, a Workers' Compensation policy. That policy shall provide employers' liability coverage with minimum liability coverage of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident for bodily injury or disease. Contractor shall provide an endorsement that the insurer waives the right of subrogation against PCMS and its respective elected officials, officers, employees, agents, representatives, contractors, trustees, and volunteers.
 - **16.4.** ☐ [REQUIRED IF BOX CHECKED] **Professional Liability Insurance**. One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for professional liability insurance as appropriate to Contractor's profession, coverage to continue through the Term plus two (2) years thereafter.

16.5. ☐ [REQUIRED IF BOX CHECKED] Abuse and Molestation Insurance. One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) general aggregate that shall protect the Contractor and PCMS from all claims of bodily injury (including emotional distress), personal injury, or advertising injury because of sexual abuse, molestation, or exploitation arising out of negligent hiring, training, and supervising practices by Contractor.

16.6. Other Insurance Provisions:

- **16.6.1.** The general liability and automobile liability policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:
 - 16.6.1.1. The PCMS, its representatives, contractors, trustees, officers, officials, employees, agents, and volunteers ("Additional Insureds") are to be covered as Additional Insureds as respects liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of the Contractor; instruments of service and completed operations of the Contractor; premises owned, occupied or used by the Contractor; or automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by the Contractor. The coverage shall contain no special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to the Additional Insureds.
 - **16.6.1.2.** The Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the Additional Insureds. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the Additional Insureds shall be in excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it
 - **16.6.1.3.** Any failure to comply with reporting or other provisions of the policies including breaches of warranties shall not affect coverage provided to the Additional Insureds.
- **16.6.2.** The Contractor's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
- **16.6.3.** Each insurance policy required by this clause shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be canceled except after thirty (30) days prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to PCMS.
- 16.6.4. Contractor shall furnish PCMS with certificates of insurance showing maintenance of the required insurance coverage and original endorsements affecting general liability and automobile liability coverage. The endorsements are to be signed by a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf. All endorsements are to be received and approved by PCMS before Services commence.
- **16.7. Acceptability of Insurers.** Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best rating of no less than A:VII, unless otherwise acceptable to PCMS.
- 17. Limitation of PCMS Liability. Other than as provided in this Agreement, PCMS's financial obligations under this Agreement shall be limited to the payment of the

compensation provided in this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event, shall PCMS be liable, regardless of whether any claim is based on contract or tort, for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including, but not limited to, lost profits or revenue, arising out of or in connection with this Agreement or the Services performed in connection with this Agreement.

- 18. Compliance with Laws; Effect of Noncompliance. Contractor shall observe and comply with all rules and regulations of the Board of Trustees of PCMS and all federal, state, and local laws, ordinances and regulations. Contractor shall give all notices required by any law, ordinance, rule and regulation bearing on conduct of the Services as indicated or specified. If Contractor observes that any of the Services required by this Agreement are at variance with any laws, ordinance, rules or regulations, Contractor shall notify PCMS, in writing, and, at the sole option of PCMS, any necessary changes to the scope of the Services shall be made and this Agreement shall be appropriately amended in writing, or this Agreement shall be terminated effective upon Contractor's receipt of a written termination notice from PCMS. If Contractor performs any work that is in violation of any laws, ordinances, rules or regulations, without first notifying PCMS of the violation, Contractor shall bear all costs arising therefrom.
 - **18.1. LABOR CODE REQUIREMENTS**: Consultant shall comply with all applicable provisions of the California Labor Code, Division 3, Part 7, Chapter 1, Articles 1 5, including, without limitation, the payment of the general prevailing per diem wage rates for public work projects of more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000). Copies of the prevailing rate of per diem wages are on file with PCMS.
- 19.Fingerprinting of Employees. The Fingerprinting/Criminal Background Investigation Certification must be completed and attached to this Agreement prior to Contractor's performing of any portion of the Services. If PCMS has determined that fingerprinting is not applicable to this Agreement, Contractor expressly acknowledges that the following conditions shall apply to any work performed by Contractor and/or Contractor Parties on a school site:
 - 19.1. All site visits shall be arranged through PCMS;
 - 19.2. Contractor and Contractor Parties shall inform PCMS of their proposed activities and location at the school site, allowing PCMS time to arrange site visits without a disruption to the educational process;
 - **19.3.** Contractor and/or Contractor Parties shall check in with the school office each day immediately upon arriving at the school site;
 - **19.4.** Once at such location, Contractor and Contractor Parties shall not change locations without contacting PCMS;
 - 19.5. Contractor and Contractor Parties shall not use student restroom facilities; and
 - **19.6.** If Contractor and Contractor Parties find themselves alone with a student, Contractor and Contractor Parties shall immediately contact the school office and request that a member of the school staff be assigned to the work location.
- 20. Notice. Any notice required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be deemed to have been given, served, and received if given in writing and either personally delivered or deposited in the United States mail, registered or certified mail, postage

prepaid, return receipt required, or sent by overnight delivery service, or facsimile or electronic transmission, addressed as follows:

Any notice personally given or sent by facsimile transmission shall be effective upon receipt. Any notice sent by overnight delivery service shall be effective the business day next following delivery thereof to the overnight delivery service. Any notice given by mail shall be effective three (3) days after deposit in the United States mail. All notices must be accompanied by a courtesy copy sent via email.

- **21. Assignment.** The obligations of the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall not be assigned by the Contractor.
- 22. No Rights In Third Parties. This Agreement does not create any rights in, or inure to the benefit of, any third party except as expressly provided herein.
- 23. Integration; Entire Agreement of Parties; Amendments. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, and agreements, whether oral or written. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by a written instrument executed by both Parties.
- **24. Governing Law.** This Agreement shall be governed by and the rights, duties and obligations of the Parties shall be determined and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of California. The Parties further agree that any action or proceeding brought to enforce the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be maintained in Butte County, California.
- 25. Disputes. In the event of a dispute between the Parties as to performance of the Services, the interpretation of this Agreement, or payment or nonpayment for work performed or not performed, the Parties shall attempt to resolve the dispute in good faith. Pending resolution of the dispute, Contractor agrees it will neither rescind the Agreement nor stop the performance of the Services, but will allow determination by the court of the State of California, Butte County, having competent jurisdiction of the dispute. Disputes may be determined by mediation, if mutually agreeable, otherwise by litigation. Notice of the demand for mediation of a dispute shall be filed in writing with the other Party to the Agreement. The demand for mediation shall be made within a reasonable time after written notice of the dispute has been provided to the other Party, but in no case longer than ninety (90) days after initial written notice. If a claim, or any portion thereof, remains in dispute upon satisfaction of all applicable dispute resolution requirements, the Contractor shall comply with all claim presentation requirements as provided in Chapter 1 (commencing with section 900) and Chapter 2 (commencing with section 910) of Part 3 of Division 3.6 of Title 1 of Government Code as a condition precedent to the Contractor's right to bring a civil action against PCMS. For purposes of those provisions, the running of the time within which a claim must be presented to PCMS shall be tolled from the time the Contractor submits its written claim until the time the claim is denied, including any time utilized by any applicable meet and confer process.

- **26. Attorney Fees; Costs.** Should litigation be necessary to enforce any terms or provisions of this Agreement, then each Party shall bear its own litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, court costs, and attorney's fees.
- **27. Waiver.** The waiver by either Party of any breach of any term, covenant, or condition herein contained shall not be deemed to be a waiver of such term, covenant, condition, or any subsequent breach of the same or any other term, covenant, or condition herein contained.
- 28. Severability. If any term, condition or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated in any way.
- **29. Counterparts.** This Agreement and all amendments and supplements to it may be executed in counterparts, and all counterparts together shall be construed as one document.
- **30. Incorporation of Recitals and Exhibits.** The Recitals and each exhibit attached hereto are hereby incorporated herein by reference.

Independent Study Program Offering Requirements: For the 2021-22 school year, Local Education Agencies must offer an independent study option to families whose students must quarantine due to exposure to, or who have tested positive with, COVID-19.

Objective: The objective of this agreement is to enable the student to successfully meet academic requirements in all classes during quarantine due to COVID-19 exposure or infection. With the support of the parent, guardian, or caregiver, and in collaboration with classroom teachers, the student will submit assignments on or before their due date.

Voluntary Statement: Independent Study is an optional educational alternative that students and their families voluntarily select, including students covered under California Education Code sections 48915 and 48917. All students who choose Independent Study/Home Study must be offered the alternative of classroom instruction, and they must have the continuing option of returning to the classroom. If the student has an individualized education program (IEP), the IEP must specifically provide for his or her enrollment in Independent Study.

Equitable Provision of Resources and Services: The Independent Study option is to be substantially equivalent in quality and quantity to classroom instruction supervised by a certificated teacher. Students who choose to engage in the program are to have equality of rights and privileges with the same access to existing services and resources as students

in the regular school program. Parents, guardians, or caretakers are responsible for the cost of replacement or repair for lost, destroyed, or willfully damaged books and other school property checked out to their student(s). Parents, guardians, or caretakers are responsible for any needed transportation for the student's classroom attendance, scheduled meetings, and any other travel covered by this agreement.

Board Policies: The Executive Director or designee shall conduct an evaluation to determine whether it is in the best interests of the pupil to remain in independent study upon the following trigger:

• In the event a student's educational progress falls below satisfactory levels as determined by the Charter School's grading policy which considers ALL of the following indicators:

- The pupil's achievement and engagement in the independent study program, as indicated by the pupil's performance on applicable pupil-level measures of pupil achievement and pupil engagement set forth in Education Code Section 52060(d) paragraphs (4) and (5).
- The completion of assignments, assessments, or other indicators that evidence that the pupil is working on assignments.
- o Learning required concepts, as determined by the supervising teacher.
- Progressing toward successful completion of the course of study or individual course, as determined by the supervising teacher.

Resources: The school will provide the instructional materials, teacher services, and other necessary items and resources as specified for each assignment. Resources must include those reasonably necessary to the achievement of the objectives and must include resources that are normally available to all students on the same terms upon which they are available to all. The school will confirm or provide access to all pupils to the connectivity and devices adequate to participate in the educational program and complete assigned work.

Documentation: LEAs are required to maintain either written or computer-based evidence of student engagement. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Aeries grade book or summary document for each class that lists assignments
- Assessments, assignments, and associated grades as posted in Google Classroom and/or Aeries
- Copies of all completed work will be kept on file by the teachers or stored digitally (ie: in Google Classroom/Drive)

Live Interaction and Synchronous Instruction with Support Teachers:

"Live interaction" means interaction between the student and local educational agency classified or certificated staff, and may include peers, provided for the purpose of maintaining school connectedness, including but not limited to: wellness checks, progress monitoring, provision of services and instruction. This interaction may take place in person or in the form of internet or telephonic communication such as email, phone calls, or teacher-student chats online.

"Synchronous instruction" means classroom-style instruction or designated small group or one-on-one instruction delivered in person, or in the form of internet or telephonic communications, and involving live two-way communication between the teacher and pupil. Synchronous instruction shall be provided by the teacher of record for that pupil pursuant to Section 51747.5.

- All instructional materials, assignments, materials, and due dates will be provided by the school and posted in Google Classroom
- Live interaction and Synchronous instruction will be available for all students for the duration of the Independent Study time via email, Google Meet sessions, or Seculry chat sessions during regularly scheduled class times or by appointment with each classroom teacher.
 - o Students will log into Google Classroom each day during the term of Independent Study
 - Teacher will monitor student progress during Synchronous Instruction using at least one of the media listed above
 - If students are unable to log in during the class period, teachers will be available by appointment at another time

Independent Study Roles and Procedures

School Office Staff will:

- Collect Master Agreements from each family upon start of the Independent Study period
- Upon notification that a student is staying home for COVID related issues, office staff will notify all teachers of student's anticipated dates of absence
- Enter student's name on the school-wide COVID-19 Independent Study Spreadsheet
- Record student program status in Aeries
- Arrange for families to pick up Independent Study materials

Teachers will:

- Prep learning materials, supplies, lessons, live links, and technology for student(s) going on Independent Study
- Post assignment descriptions, materials, and due dates for assignments in the scope of Independent Study dates on Google Classroom
- Provide needed support to students on Independent Study
- Open a Securly session during each regularly scheduled live class period to allow for live interaction and synchronous instruction
- Upon completion of Independent Study:
 - Grade and post copies of all completed work in Google Classroom, and/or Aeries, and/or keep hard copies of work
 - If work is incomplete, make arrangements with student to provide support in completing missing work
 - o Communicate with the office
- Be prepared to submit dated student work samples if requested by the auditor
